

We Need You In Jerusalem!

Calling all pediatric dentists and endodontists! DVI's young patients represent the most underserved communities in Jerusalem. Coming from low-income families, many of them have never been seen by a dentist before and have complex dental issues that require the special skills of a pediatric dentist or an endodontist.

That's why this year AFDVI attended the AAPD annual meeting in San Diego to recruit more pediatric dentists to volunteer.

In July, DVI was honored to have a visit from Dr. Joel Berg, Dean of the University of Washington School of Dentistry and President of the American Association of Pediatric Dentistry, and Dr. Anna Fuks, Professor Emeritus at Hebrew University's Hadassah School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Berg hopes to help us recruit more volunteer pediatric dentists from the US, and we also look forward to having him lecture on behalf of DVI on his next visit to Israel.

Oral Health Outreach in Remote Bedouin Village



In February, Arab-Israeli dentist Arin Jamil set out with DVI's Michelle Levine and Operation Blessing's Jennifer Allen to improve the oral health of the children in a remote Bedouin village in the Negev region. Dr. Jamil went through the basics, from demonstrating brushing technique, to giving an explanation of how caries form, and engaging the children in activities with Arabic language oral health coloring sheets. She also distributed toothbrushes and toothpaste to the kids and left a gift of oral health education lesson plans and an Arabic language picture book with an oral health message.

The community was so taken with Dr. Jamil that the village Sheik had to meet her for himself. He took her to see his camel and sheep, of which he was very proud. He explained that as a yet-unrecognized village, Israel is not required to provide basic infrastructure.

For years, their community has used a gas-powered generator for all of their electrical needs—thus families have had neither electricity nor running water except in communal areas. Recently, the community installed a solar-powered generator, which has had a profound impact on the residents' quality of life.

In 2011, a new school was established in the village, and since then, the children have been attending school with their mothers. Both generations are learning to read together. Now they will be brushing their teeth together, too! Before she left, the mothers asked that Dr. Jamil check the mouths of their children for caries, and entreated her to return soon to the village to check on their progress. We followed up with their teacher, Anita, who helped established the school and she said:

"After Dr. Jamil had checked the children's mouths and identified which children needed attention, we wrote a letter to the parents advising them to take them to a dentist for a check-up. The children continue with their healthy eating program and are generally enjoying life and kindergarten!"

One Volunteer's Special Connection to DVI

When Dr. Fred Khalili of Great Neck, New York applied to volunteer at DVI last year, he was motivated by his desire to use his skills as a dentist to help lessfortunate children and their families. Dr. Khalili has always felt a connection to Israel, and to Jerusalem in particular, but he was surprised to learn of a very personal connection to the DVI clinic.

Just before his trip to Jerusalem and DVI in February, Dr. Khalili's wife Parisa was looking at a map of Jerusalem and the DVI clinic, and she remembered that as a young child, she herself had been a patient at the little dental clinic on Mekor Chaim!

Parisa was born in Iran, and when she was 10 years old moved with her family to Israel. As new immigrants, they were referred by a social worker in Jerusalem to the DVI clinic. Parisa recalls that as a child, she "loved visiting the clinic, because the staff were very nice, especially the dentists, who treated us in a friendly and caring way. I also liked to sit in the back room and watch movies while waiting, and eventually getting a prize or a toothbrush at the end."








DVI Expands Care to Children and Youth Ages 4-20
